LOCAL LAW NO.: 2 OF 1999
Amendment of Local Law No.: 2 of 1996,
"Disposal of Solid or Liquid Waste"

Section I. Legislative Intent.

By adoption of this local law the Village of Whitehall declares its intent to regulate, control or prohibit the dumping, storing, or placing of certain kinds of solid or liquid waste material originating from inside or outside the boundaries of the Village of Whitehall or creating a dump or dumping ground of such materials within the village.

Section II. Definitions.

As used in this local law, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

SOLID OR LIQUID WASTE - All putrescible and non putrescible solid wastes including garbage, human sewage, rubbish, ashes, incinerator residue, street and building demolition and construction debris, metals, offal, commercial and industrial wastes, and hazardous and wastes as defined by Department of Environmental Conservation and the Environmental Protection Agency.

ABANDONED VEHICLES - Unroad worthy or uninspected, registered and insured for 6 months out of any 12 month period. Limit one per household.

INTERIOR FURNISHINGS/APPLIANCES - Objects manufactured and intended for use in side a dwelling such as, but not limited to, washing machine, clothes dryer, cook stove, range, furnace, couch, chair and other items subject to the discretion of the enforcement officer when in the opinion thereof, said furnishings are intended for interior use and constitute a danger to life, health or are a detriment to the aesthetics of the neighborhood.

OPEN AREA - Any area, porch, garage, shed or yard where objects are exposed to the elements or penetrable by animals.

Section III. CERTAIN ACTIVITIES PROHIBITED.

- A. The dumping, storing, or placing of any kind of solid or liquid waste material within the Village of Whitehall which is picked up, brought or transported from inside or outside the Village of Whitehall is prohibited.
- B. The creation and/or operation of sanitary landfills, dumps or dumping grounds within the Village of Whitehall for solid or liquid waste coming

from inside or outside the boundaries of the Village of Whitehall is prohibited.

- C. The storage or placing of interior furnishings or appliances upon any open area which may include, but not limited to, a porch, garage, shed or yard area within the Village of Whitehall, where such furnishings are exposed to the elements is hereby prohibited.
- D. The storage or placing of refuse in plastic bags in any open areas as described in Section III, Paragraph C, shall not be permitted. Refuse must be stored in a container that is weatherproof and impenetrable by domestic or wild animals.

Section IV. Permitted Fill.

Clean said, topsoil, vegetation and nontoxic substances may be used for fill in the Village of Whitehall.

Section V. Penalties for Offenses.


Any person committing an offense against this local law shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both such fine and imprisonment. The continuation of an offense against the provisions of this local law constitute, for each day the offense is continued, a separate and distinct offense hereunder. In addition to the above penalties and punishment, the Village Board may also maintain an action or proceeding in the name of the village in a court of competent jurisdiction to compel compliance with or to restrain by injunction the violation of such local law.

Section VI. Severability.

The invalidity of any section, provision or portion of this local law shall not invalidate or affect the validity of any other section, provision or remaining portion thereof.

Section VII. Effective Date.

This Local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with all applicable laws.

Any person committing an offense against this local law shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both such fine and imprisonment. The continuation of an offense against the provisions of this local law constitute, for each day the offense is continued, a separate and distinct offense hereunder. In addition to the above penalties and punishment, the Village Board may also maintain an action or proceeding in the name of the village in a court of competent jurisdiction to compel compliance with or to restrain by injunction the violation of such local law.

Section VI. Severability.

The invalidity of any section, provision or portion of this local law shall not invalidate or affect the validity of any other section, provision or remaining portion thereof.

Section VII. Effective Date.

This Local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with all applicable laws.
