Brandon Sparks and Daniel Pitts of the Skenesborough EMS presented with concerns for the future of the Rescue Squad in relation to revenue. The EMS has more expenses going out than revenue coming in. Whitehall has an aging population with Medicare/Medicaid as insurance which pays the EMS minimum amounts per call. Skenesborough EMS uses paid staff more due to the lack of volunteers. Brandon Sparks stated that the community needs an ambulance in Whitehall if not the wait times for help will be longer. They are asking for any financial help that the Village may be able to give them.

The mixer needs to be repaired to correct the high TTHM issues. Motion made by Trustee LaChapelle, seconded by Trustee Watson to allocate the remaining \$7,686.36 of COVID relief funds towards the bill for Solar Bee to inspect and repair the mixer at the Water tank, all voting in favor,

Chief Buxton stated that Sgt. Mattison has started working. The Police Department received a grant for \$16,000.00 to purchase 8 body cameras.
